

Letter of Request

The following letter is a request for the taking of evidence in the Kingdom of Thailand in civil proceedings taking place in the economic department of the Israeli District Court. As part of the proceedings, the Israeli Court requested the testimony by video-conference of the defendant, an Israeli citizen serving a prison sentence in a detention facility in the Kingdom of Thailand, subject to the approval of the Kingdom of Thailand and in cooperation with the appropriate authorities.

The following are parties to the case:

The defendant, Yohai Gild Golan, ID number 033295916, is an Israeli citizen serving a prison sentence in Ko Samui after being convicted of a crime by the a court in Thailand.

The proceedings in question consist of a civil case regarding an alleged breach of contract. The plaintiff had filed a lawsuit against the defendant to receive 5,575 shares of Cann Pharmaceutical Ltd, an Israeli corporation, or the equivalent value of shares for the sum of NIS 9,450,350 (approx. 2.8 Million USD). The plaintiff claims that he and the defendant had a verbal agreement under which they would split the shares between themselves, as the shares were purchased by the defendant from a third party. The defendant claims that no such agreement was ever made, verbal or otherwise. On the contrary, the defense submits that the agreement was for the defendant to pay the plaintiff a loan, and that the shares were given only as collateral for the loan payment.

The defendant is a party to the proceeding and the Court has agreed to the defendants' request to appear before it and to be cross-examined.

Given his current situation, the Israeli Ministry of Justice/Israel Attorney General respectfully requests the Kingdom of Thailand that his appearance before the Court for

cross-examination via video conference be approved and accommodated. The date and time of the testimony and cross-examination have yet to be determined, pursuant to this procedure; however, it would be preferable to be as soon as possible as the defendant is the last witness left to be heard in the framework of the proceeding. Should the appropriate authorities of the Kingdom of Thailand approve this request in principle, Israel's [Courts Administration Authority] will coordinate the timing and modalities of the videoconferencing with such authorities.

Any fees and costs incurred will be borne by the defendant and the third party, who is also the mother of the defendant.

We hope that this request will be favorably considering and thank you in advance for your cooperation. We remain available for any addition questions you may have.
